

## NATIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICT JOB DESCRIPTION

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### JOB TITLE: SPEECH LANGUAGE PATHOLOGIST

**Job Purpose Statement(s):** Under the direction of the Director of Student Support Services, provides speech and language therapy services to students with articulation, voice, fluency, pragmatic and/or language disorders, as well as to students having auditory impairments.

#### Essential Job Functions:

- **Identifies**, assesses and remediates students who have deficits in speech and language which interfere with progress in general curriculum.
- **Organizes** identified students into instructional groups and provides an instructional program designed to address speech language delays.
- **Consults** with teachers of students identified as students with speech and language deficits.
- **Assists** teachers in identifying and referring students who have possible speech language disorders.
- **Consults** with teachers of students with hearing impairments regarding needs of such students.
- **Provides** information and resources to students, parents and teachers regarding hearing impairments.
- **Plans** own schedule and caseload to meet identified needs.
- **Provides** information to parents relating to community services available for speech and hearing impaired students.
- **Makes** periodic reports regarding educational progress towards goals/objectives to parents and school personnel for each student on their caseload.
- **Maintains** required records and makes reports as directed.
- **Complies** with all laws, timelines and district requirements related to paperwork of services provided to special education students.

- **Serves** as resource person to Student Study Team at school site and to other district personnel.
- **Completes** required student initial evaluations and three-year re-evaluations and develops legally compliant IEPs and assessment reports.

**Other Job Functions:**

- **Performs** other duties as assigned.

**Job Requirements-Qualifications:**

Skills, Knowledge and/or Abilities to assess students to determine eligibility for speech and language services; provide speech and language services to identified special education students; consults with teachers regarding accommodations necessary in the general education program; participates in Student Study Team meetings on the school site.

**Licenses, Certifications, Bonding and/or Testing Required:** Valid California Clear Clinical or Rehabilitative Services Credential; valid California driver's license, Criminal Justice Fingerprint Clearance.
