


Scholastic Reading Counts

Teacher Management and Student Use

Here are the desktop icons that are created when Reading Counts is installed on your computer.




The first thing you might want to do is to hide the "Scholastic Teacher" icon if you don't want students trying to open it. You can delete the icon - it's just a shortcut, and you can get to the teacher management by using the "Start" button. Go to "Programs", then scroll to "Scholastic" to find it.



Here is the login window for the "Scholastic Teacher" management tool. In this example, teachers have already been set up with their passwords. Just select your name on the list, click on "OK", then type in your password in the next window and "OK" that one, too. (You can just press the "Enter" key to "OK" these dialog boxes. You don't need to grab the mouse!)




Here is the window for the Teacher Management tools. Here the "Students" tab is selected and students are listed in the box.




You can view an individual student's settings.

- Just select the student.
- Click on "Edit" button.


Here you can see the enrollment info for the student you selected. Scholastic has told us: DO NOT use the middle initial field. Also, very important - DO NOT use dashes, apostrophes or any other characters in student names other than alphabetic letters!



This student is enrolled in both Reading Counts and Read 180. (See the check marks.)




In this view, all students have been selected, and we are about to make settings for Reading Counts.




In this dialog box, you can set goals for your students and adjust optional features for Reading Counts.

In this view, one student has been selected and the "Reports" button pressed. We can now select which report we want to view and/or print. The program will print every report that you check on the list. Remember that there may be multiple alerts.




This is the "Book Expert". From here you can search for books based on many categories including culture, interest level, genre, awards, skills taught, and so on. You can also set the "book range" to a lexile or points limit. You can select an individual title in the list below and click on "Book Info" above to get a little synopsis!




Reading Counts - Student Use

Here is the login screen. The student types in first and last name, then presses the "Enter" key to OK the window.



Next the student selects her or his name from the list, clicks on OK (press "enter") and then types in the password. You might just leave the password field blank in your setup to make this part easier!

The student can now take a quiz, check on progress, or exit the program.



Here is a sample of what students see when they check their progress. They will see how many books they have read, the titles and authors, their scores on the quizzes, how many points they have earned, and how many words they have read!

If the student elects to take a quiz, he or she must find the book in the list of installed quizzes. You can type in the first few words of the title, then press the "Enter" key to search the list. Once you find the right quiz, click on it to select it, then click on the "OK" button.



To start the quiz, the student clicks on the GO! button.



This is the format for the quiz. It is multiple choice. If the student takes the quiz more than once, they will not get the same questions. (The quiz will randomly pick 10 out of a bank of 30 questions.) If the student elects to "Exit" the test before finishing, this will be counted as an attempt.
