This information is necessary in order to maintain accurate records of the meeting. Speakers are requested to limit their remarks to three minutes.

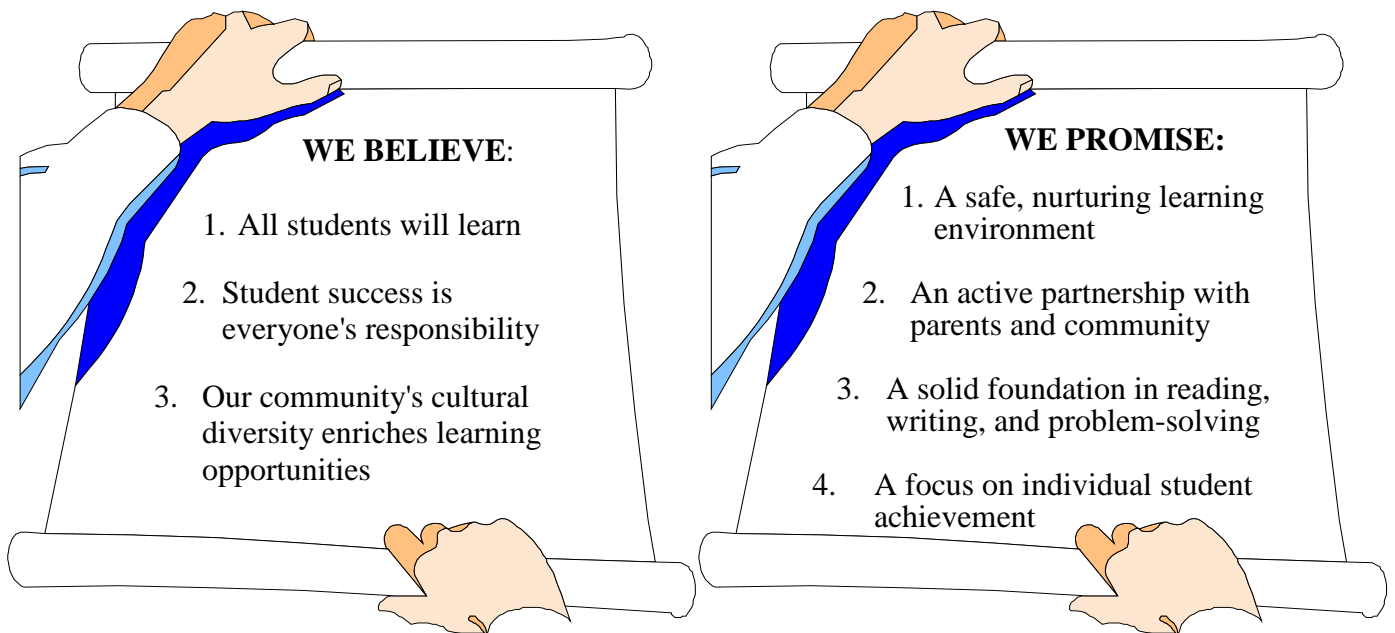
